





The City recognizes that the proposed project has the potential to affect the Apex River, Lake Qikiqtalik and the proposed reservoir area. This requires careful consideration through the Nunavut Water Board process in the context of Iqaluit's critical need for a secure, reliable and sustainable long-term drinking water supply. The City is committed to addressing appropriate requirements while advancing the infrastructure necessary to meet the community's current and future water needs.

Water capacity is also directly connected to housing and community development. When available water supply is constrained, the City's ability to approve and support new housing is constrained as well. Advancing the new reservoir is therefore not only a water infrastructure project, but also an important part of enabling Iqaluit to build more homes and support future growth.
