Current Projects

Business Issues Research Project

- ➤ Over 2 fiscal years, this project will identify the Baffin business community's position on the key issues effecting economic development in the region. This project will utilize extensive consultations with the business community and other stakeholders in the region to identify the issues and recommendations that will be communicated back to the relevant stakeholders who can best effect the changes desired by the business community.
- ➤ Results will be distributed to members, stakeholders and others together with the top 4–7 priorities of the business community both printed and electronic form. This information will guide the chamber in its efforts to work with stakeholders to improve the overall economy of the region and territory.

CoursePark Nunavut Language Act

As a service to our membership, we have sought and received funding from the National Research Council to develop an online, interactive Language Act Online Training Module for small businesses. The proposed course will explain in plain language the impacts of the Language Act on Nunavut businesses. It will be a "made in Nunavut" module, with images, graphics, language and content relevant to small business owners in the Territory.

CoursePark Nunavut Training Systems Implementation


The Coursepark Nunavut Training System gives access to literally thousands of online courses in order for Nunavummiut to increase and diversify their skill sets. It enables businesses to not only to increase their competitiveness, but to be able to invest in their staff through training, increasing the chance of retaining employees for the long term. The training available will be accessible to anyone with an internet connection, and eliminate the high cost of travel associated with training opportunities being offered in major centers.

BRCC and Economic Development

- Take the steps to ensure full use of currently available training programs that allow Nunavummiut to participate in our economic growth sectors, and in particular, in mining, fishing, and tourism.
- Support research on the educational and skills levels of Nunavummiut and identify gaps in relation to economic opportunities.
- To identify programs that support opportunities that are required to help develop Nunavut's Natural Resources. Limited human resources. Through the success of the CED Weeks many sectors come together to focus on youth and development and the potential to fill the human resource needs for the future.

Economic Development

- Develop and implement policies and best practices to ensure capital projects help to achieve training and business development objectives.
- Working with NNI group to provide clear direction how Nunavut businesses benefit from NNI policies.



Economic Development

- Establish broadband networks in all Nunavut communities that are accessible by municipal government, community-based organizations, and by the private sector.
- Bring together the decision makers in round table discussions in events such as trade show & conferences such as Northern Lights 2014
- Investigate other areas where inter-community trade might be practical and supportive of Nunavut's overall economic development.
