- 1. Current Recreation funding applications- Conor Goddard
 - Requested over a million dollars for programs for city use
 - Approximately a third of which has been approved to date
 - City recreation dept. received \$7,500 participation award for most active Nunavut community

2. Facilities Update- Stephanie Clark

- Arnaitok Arena is shifting
- Arnaitok Arena in need of a new ice plant in a year or two
- AWG Arena in need of a new ice plant

- AWG Floors need of repair due to water damaged, getting repaired now
- Youth Centre floors need of repair due to water damage, not immediate
- Curling Rink in need of a new ice plant
- Curling Rink Ice plant in need of a new placement
- Curling Rink in need of new pipes
- 3. Fall and Winter Programming Review- Justin Tambogon
 - Returning to programing
 - Elders Program starting up with food programs and opening of Elders Qammaq
 - Youth Centre reopening with limited programming, working into regular YC schedule
 - Youth Centre reaching out to Inuit organizations for support and provide additional programming
 - Hoping to opening Abe Okpik Hall for after school programs ages 6-11 during fall and winter
 - Aquatic Centre pool plan to go from 25 people to full capacity
 - Swimming lessons will start in the fall and winter
 - School swims with start in the fall and winter
 - Solo-workout have started
 - Personal Training has started the month of August
 - Drop-in classes have started the month of August
 - Per-registered programs have started the month of August
 - 25 is the capacity right now for gym and studio use
 - Arnaitok Arena will continue to be open, expecting organized sports
 - AWG Arena ice will be postponed till mid October due to construction
 - Turf will be on till end of September
- 4. COVID Impacts on the Recreation Department- Rubina Hoque
 - 2020 about \$1.2 Million (shutdown from March June 20 and November 18 December 2)
 - o 2021 IAC is projecting \$133,995 from April 15 June 7
 - Data was from 2019 revenue sales in IAC (all programs)
 - Program Impacts

- IAC has not been able to complete a full set of Swimming Lessons since 2019 (uninterrupted 8 weeks)
- Personal Training put on hold due to capacity restrictions in the Fitness Centre
- Hot Tub and Sauna closed; reopening this week
- Primary focus was on shorter programs (drop in classes, drop in swims) rather that continuous progressive classes

Staff Impacts

- Increasing demand for programs from guests, despite the capacity restrictions
- Increased cleaning protocols for all Building Custodians and Facility workers
 Day Camp staff ratio has to stay the same despite capacity increase
