City of Igaluit - Request for Decision

Topic: Date of the Date of the

District Heat System (DHS) Agreement

Date: March 17, 2020

Proposed By: Amy Elgersma, Chief Administrative Officer

Benefits:

Connecting to the District Heat System will benefit the City as follows:

- The City expects to save 25% of its fuel costs annually for the connected facilities. The savings is estimated at \$150,000 per year.
- The City will reduce its Green House Gas Emissions
- The City will quality for its outstanding \$375,000 grant under the FCM Green Municipal Fund for the Aquatic Centre (one year after deomonstrated energy performance)
- Utilizing the DHS will reduce hours of the facilities boilers
- Utilizing the DHS will provide a secondary heat source for the connected facilities (risk management)

Disadvantages:

• None identified

Options:

- 1. Enter into an agreement with QEC for the provision of District Heat for the Aquatic Centre, Water Treatment Plan, Booster Station and Reheat Station
- 2. Not enter into an agreement with QEC for District Heat

QEC sets the rate based mainly on the price of fuel. QEC uses a formula to calculate the cost to produce heat using diesel fuel and then applies a discount in percentage.

Based on new Heating fuel rate, Thermal Energy Rate (Heat Rate) for City accounts will be 0.0757 \$/kWh.
